The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

- (1) This Act is the Conservation Amendment Act 2004.
- (2) In this Act, the Conservation Act 1987 is called “the principal Act”.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on 1 January 2005.

3 Application of Part

- (1) Section 26ZG(2) of the principal Act is amended by omitting the words “Except as provided in section 26ZM(7) of this Act,”.
- (2) Section 26ZG(2) of the principal Act is amended by repealing paragraph (c), and substituting the following paragraph:
 - “(c) the taking, holding, possession, sale, or disposal of freshwater fish under the authority of—
 - “(i) the Fisheries Act 1983, the Marine Farming Act 1971, or any regulations made under either of those Acts; or
 - “(ii) the registration of a fish farmer under Part 9A of the Fisheries Act 1996.”

- (3) Section 26ZG of the principal Act is amended by adding the following subsection:
- “(3) To avoid doubt, subsection (2) does not limit or affect section 26ZI or section 26ZM.”
