

## **Further submission in support of submission on the publicly notified proposed national policy statement for renewable electricity generation**

This is a further submission in support of a submission on the proposed national policy statement for renewable electricity generation (the proposal).

We support the submission of:

Ngati Kahungunu Iwi Incorporated (No 27)

**We support the submission in its entirety, and in particular:**

Paragraph 2(e): requesting that proper consultation be undertaken with Ngati Kahungunu hapu before further decisions on the proposed NPS are made; and seeking the addition of a Treaty clause to the NPS in recognition of the Crown's responsibilities.

Paragraph 4(f): requesting that an additional objective be added to the NPS with reference to the principles of the Treaty of Waitangi, the protection of Tangata Whenua values and customary practices, and for new policies relevant to achieving this (new) objective.

Paragraph 5(a): requesting the addition of a policy to specifically prevent the degradation of features and landscapes significant to Maori, due to maintenance, development or expansion of renewable electricity generation facilities.

The reasons for our support are:

MTSI represents Ngati Marangatuhetaua (Ngati Tu) a hapu of Ngati Kahungunu. MTSI has been involved in litigation opposing Unison Networks Limited's proposed Te Waka Wind Farm on Maungaharuru in Hawkes Bay. This maunga has been recognised by the Environment Court as having immense cultural significance to Ngati Tu. Also, it has in part been recognised as an outstanding landscape by the Court. MTSI (along with Ngati Hineuru Iwi Incorporated (NHII)) has been successful in opposing Unison's proposal in the Environment Court and on appeal to the High Court. MTSI and NHII are currently opposing a modified application by Unison on the same site, with proceedings commencing in the Environment Court on 8 December 2008.

We support NKII's submissions because we have first hand experience of the conflict between a proposed windfarm, and our values as tangata whenua. We understand that our earlier cases are the first of their kind – where the potential impacts of a windfarm have been weighed against tangata whenua and landscape values.

We seek that the whole of the submission be allowed
