Long-term target	<p>I support the most ambitious target of reducing total greenhouse gases to net zero much earlier than 2050.</p> <p>I also support taking a science-based approach to ensure our efforts to reduce emissions are as impactful as possible: we should aim for negative levels of long-lived gases, while reducing short-lived gases to below sustainable levels. This target should be reached by reducing our own emissions and not by using international carbon credits.</p>
Climate Commission	I support the establishment of an independent Climate Commission that is made up of experts and provides advice, and: that will "strongly" influence final decisions from our government.
Adaptation	I support a plan for adaptation being included in the Zero Carbon Act.
Climate justice	A Zero Carbon Act must be just and fair in that it honours Te Tiriti o Waitangi; ensures a just transition for workers and communities; and avoids passing on the costs to future generations.
Further comments	To do this, important decisions must be made to transition away from our high intensity and fast expansion of the dairy sector.
