Clause

1. What process should the Government use to set a new emissions reduction target in legislation?

Position

The Government sets a 2050 target in legislation now

Notes

I am calling on Parliament to build cross-party consensus on the direction of New Zealand's climate change response and lock an ambitious 2050 target into law.

2. If the Government sets a 2050 target now, which is the best target for New Zealand?

Position

Net Zero Emissions - Net zero emissions across all greenhouse gases by 2050

Notes

This means recognising the difference between long-lived greenhouse gases (such as carbon dioxide and nitrous oxide) and short-lived greenhouse gases (such as methane).

3. How should New Zealand meet its targets?

Position

Domestic emissions reductions only (including from new forest planting)

Notes

Relying on international carbon credits (even if the credits have integrity) creates uncertainty about what reductions need to be achieved in New Zealand.

4. Should the Zero Carbon Bill allow the 2050 target to be revised if circumstances change?

5. The Government proposes that three emissions budgets of five years each (i.e. covering the next 15 years) be in place at any given time. Do you agree with this proposal?

Notes

No. Budgets should only be revised in exceptional circumstances. It is not appropriate for a new government to "have a say" on an upcoming budget which has already been set.
