2. If the Government sets a 2050 target now, which is the best target for New Zealand?

**Position**

Net Zero Emissions - Net zero emissions across all greenhouse gases by 2050

**Notes**

Long-lived gases are the biggest priority. These need to reach net zero by 2050. While short-lived gases have a smaller impact and a smaller priority than long-lived gases, stabilising them isn't enough. By 2050, we should at least be reducing short-lived gases, if not getting them to net-zero.

4. Should the Zero Carbon Bill allow the 2050 target to be revised if circumstances change?

**Position**

Yes

**Notes**

Only under advice from the Climate Change Commission - not from whims of government on the day. These targets should be designed to be forward thinking, with intermediate targets of a decade or more. Any revision would have to fit into these long term targets, rather than changes to the outright goal.
