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## Objectives for the contribution

1b. What is most important to you?

The most important thing to me is that I strongly feel that we have already waited far too long to seriously address Climate Change, the greatest threat to all life on earth in history. If we stop now to worry about our own possible difficulties we will vastly limit our ability to take a strong stand among all other nations to solve humanity's greatest threat of all time.

6. Is there any further information you wish the Government to consider? Please explain.

We ask that the Intended Nationally Determined Contributions (INDC) be:

1. Committed to a global and New Zealand zero carbon target by 2050 or sooner with annual steps to get there as soon as possible.
2. Places an immediate moratorium on fossil fuel exploration and pledges to phase out existing extraction in the next decade.
3. Includes credible transparent, cross party plans with a registered independent Climate Commission to ensure New Zealand meets its target and stays within the global carbon budget.
4. Abides by articles laid out in the Treaty of Waitangi.
5. Includes health and fairness and the true cost of inaction on climate change in the assessment of costs and benefits.
6. Follows transparent decision making process after the consultation period ends.
